

Grace Bay Resorts Community Foundations Efforts from the last quarter of 2009 to Dec 2010

The GBR Community Foundation (“the Foundation”) was formed to formalize the many years of community service provided to the Turks & Caicos Islands by staff and principals of Grace Bay Club and The Veranda Resort. Under the leadership of Dr. Carlton Mills the Foundation was officially established in August 2009 and is now comprised of approximately 20 employees from the two properties. The Foundation has earmarked a total of \$100,000 per year for its initiatives.

As a longstanding member of the tourism & business community of the Turks & Caicos Islands, The Foundation has become known as a leader in charitable and community initiatives throughout all of the Islands in the country. With a strong focus placed on assisting Government schools and students, the Foundation’s primary goal is to encourage young talent to become future leaders and nurture personal growth and responsibility in the next generation of the country.

 - A 40' container of furniture is donated to the High School in Grand Turk
 - A 40' container of furniture is donated to the Ministry of Education in Provo to distribute to schools
 - Grace Bay Resorts Community Foundation launches Scholarship program to the local community college
 - Electrical repairs is provided to a classroom block at Adelaide Omeler in North Caicos

- 6 Students are selected for work experience from Clement Howell High School; from October 2010 to May 2011

- Partnership with local corporate companies was launched together with the Adopt-A-Roundabout; Partners LIME & FCIB
 - 'whatsinthebox' is unveiled in the spirit of Holidays
 - Grace Bay Resorts Community Foundation and partners, LIME and FCIB as well as Parrot Cay, Air Turks, IGA, Island Pride and other important vendors throw Christmas Party's for all 4 adopted schools in North and South Caicos
 - An additional 6 interns from the Community College are hired in conjunction with the internship program
